We chase big things—dream homes, vacations, success—believing they'll satisfy us. But I've found that fulfillment often comes from the most unexpected places. I've planned dream trips that felt underwhelming, only to have a work trip to Nicaragua fill my soul in ways I never imagined. I once asked my kids if they'd rather go to Disney World again or go back to Nicaragua. Without missing a beat, they chose Nicaragua.

When folks go on trips with SuNica, they return transformed, talking about the people. They find life in the bonds they build... but why? Why do rural Nicaraguan communities offer more fulfillment than a dream vacation?

In Matthew 10:39, Jesus says, "Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

The Christian life is full of paradoxes. The infinite God becomes a baby. The weak are strong. The last are first. A life lost is a life found. There's power in giving up your desires to move toward

God and others. In doing so, you find the life you were made for. It's in dying to yourself that you become most alive.

That's often what happens when folks visit
Nicaragua. People are swept up in the relational
atmosphere, where life centers on God's work and
the people He's working through. In loving others
and letting go of personal wants, they find true life.

Doña Zorayda found life in an unexpected way. At 20, she dreamed of starting over in the U.S., but that door never opened. Instead, she became SuNica's chef, pouring her energy into serving others. In that sacrificial service, she discovered the deeper life Jesus spoke of—a life found not in personal gain, but in giving and in community. Like Zorayda, many others have found life in surprising ways, and you'll read their stories

JOSE ANTONIO

Found through GRACE.

Jose Antonio, SuNica's longtime water engineer, knows what it means to be strong. But last year, a painful fall in the Sacred Forest left him physically broken and spiritually emptied. After recovering from knee surgery, only to be injured again, he found himself wrestling with frustration and the silence of God.

So he returned to the Forest with local director Josh—this time, to just be still. There, in the silence, something shifted. The pain was

still there, but so was peace. God's nearness began to feel like enough.

Jose Antonio later shared a devotional on how trials can be both a temptation and test. His journey through injury, disappointment, and healing has made him more than a leader—he's a living reminder that even when everything falls apart, we are never alone. Jose Antonio was found in a hard place—and is now leading others with renewed clarity and grace.

OSLIN

Found through BELONGING.

Oslin grew up with deep wounds.

Abandoned by his parents and raised by his grandmother, he entered SuNica's discipleship program as a shy, guarded boy. That's where he met Leo, a discipleship leader with a similar past. Leo saw Oslin's potential, helped him realize that he had a purpose, and that God had a good plan for him.

Through Bible studies, birthday celebrations, beach trips, and one powerful retreat in the Sacred Forest, Oslin began to believe that he was not forgotten. When his mom reached out years later, the hurt didn't just

disappear—but the forgiveness planted in his heart during that retreat helped him respond with grace.

Today, Oslin is mentoring younger boys, volunteering at his church, leading a soccer group, and returning to school with the help of a SuNica scholarship. His story isn't a headline—it's the slow, steady kind of transformation that only happens when someone is truly known and deeply loved.

Oslin had been found—not just by a mentor, but by a Father who will never leave him.

ZORAYDA Found through PURPOSE.

Doña Zorayda is more than SuNica's beloved cook—she's a radiant force of joy and faith. But her story, like so many others, began with hardship. At age 20, she left Nicaragua for the U.S. in search of a better life, only to land in a Mexican prison. With the help of kind strangers and a renewed trust in God, she returned home and began to rebuild.

Eventually, she found SuNica... or maybe SuNica found her. Now, after eight years on staff, she sees the kitchen as her sanctuary. From planning meals to her early morning prayer rhythms, she pours

love into every detail. Her *sopa de res* is legendary, but it's her heart for people that makes every meal memorable.

Zorayda says she was born to cook. But it's her faith—steady, warm, ever-present—that fills the kitchen even more than the aroma of her Jalapeño Chicken dish (Alan's favorite!).

Every meal she prepares is more than a job—it's an act of worship. And through her unwavering faith, we see God too.
